

This report is in agreement with the terms outlined in Section 8.4 of the License Agreement between the City of Austin and Austin Pets Alive! with a focus on APA!'s impact on Travis county through our partnership with Austin Animal Center.

Summary: Austin Pets Alive! (APA!) continues to be the city of Austin's largest partner in lifesaving. APA! takes animals that have medical and behavioral issues that require a higher cost per animal than the average healthy animal in care. APA! focuses on these animals in an effort to have a measurable effect on the live release rate at AAC.

APA! Intakes transferred from AAC:

251 animals were transferred out of AAC to rescue partners in July. 168, or 66.9%, of those were transferred to APA! *The AAC dashboard indicates 161 transfers to APA!, but there are 7 missing.*

11 animals were born in APA!'s care to pregnant animals sent from AAC. Additionally, APA! took in 82 pets directly from owners within Travis county through the PASS program that should have otherwise entered AAC. This makes for a total of 93 intakes diverted from AAC, a 10.2% intake reduction.
