

Monthly Report on License Agreement 2023-08 August

This report is in agreement with the terms outlined in Section 8.4 of the License Agreement between the City of Austin and Austin Pets Alive! with a focus on APA!'s impact on Travis county through our partnership with Austin Animal Center.

Austin Pets Alive! (APA!) continues to be the city of Austin's largest partner in lifesaving. APA! takes animals that have medical and behavioral concerns that require a higher cost per animal than the average healthy animal, in an effort to have a measurable effect on the live release rate at AAC.

APA! Intakes transferred from AAC:

240 animals were transferred out of AAC to rescue partners in August. 217, or 90.4%, of those were transferred to APA! *The AAC dashboard indicates 208 transfers to APA!*, *APA! shows 217.* In addition, APA! took in 46 pets directly from owners within Travis county through the PASS program that should have otherwise entered AAC. This makes for a 4.7% intake reduction for AAC.

The AAC/APA! pilot boarding program began in August, with the first 16 dogs transferring to APA!'s care. Three of these dogs were adopted through APA! in August. The transfer numbers below do not include all boarding dogs, only those who were adopted during the month.
