

This report is in agreement with the terms outlined in Section 8.4 of the License Agreement between the City of Austin and Austin Pets Alive! with a focus on APA!'s impact on Travis county through our partnership with Austin Animal Center.

Austin Pets Alive! (APA!) continues to be the city of Austin's largest partner in lifesaving. APA! takes animals that have medical and behavioral concerns that require a higher cost per animal than the average healthy animal, in an effort to have a measurable effect on the live release rate at AAC.

APA! Intakes transferred from AAC:

145 animals were transferred out of AAC to rescue partners in September. 117, or 80.7%, of those were transferred to APA! *The AAC dashboard indicates 114 transfers to APA!*, *APA! shows 117*.

46 animals were born in APA!'s care to pregnant animals sent from AAC. Additionally, APA! took in 52 pets directly from owners within Travis county through the PASS program that should have otherwise entered AAC. This makes for 98 intakes diverted from AAC, effectively a 9.7% intake reduction.

APA! Intakes from AAC and Community

In Fiscal Year 2023:

- APA! transferred 1,747 animals directly from AAC. This accounts for 16.3% of AAC's total intake over the same time period, and 14.57% of the prior fiscal year intake.
- APA! diverted an additional 977 Travis County animals from AAC through direct owner surrender via the PASS program.
- APA! took in 64 medium/large at-risk behavior dogs from AAC (and 8 small), 13 of which had already been given a euthanasia notice. Three additional dogs were evaluated and declined for transfer. Of the 75 total behavior dogs that APA! evaluated, their current statuses are:
