



Medical Activities

Our lifesaving, innovative programs are the last resort for the most vulnerable of animals in municipal facilities. Without the support of volunteers we wouldn't be able to offer this care while operating on a shoestring. Our medical activities range from administrative work in the clinic to providing lifesaving care to our neonates and parvo puppies.

Our medical positions do require specific capabilities. All medical activities do require volunteers to be 18+ years of age.

APA! Clinic

Assist in clinic areas like reception and recovery; ensure pets are up to date on all medical requirements prior to attending adoption events; ensure medical information is in database; help fosters with medical questions; coordinate medical needs with veterinarians.

Additional training may be required. Must be 18+ years of age.

Neonatal Ward

Feed and care for neonatal kittens in the on-site neonatal ICU. Ensure sanitation of ward, all equipment, and supplies. Shifts available around the clock; volunteers must be able to commit to regular 3 hour shifts during kitten season. *Additional training required. Must be 18 years of age or older*

Parvo Puppy ICU

Parvo is a contagious disease among puppies that can be cured with treatment. Help care for puppies that have parvovirus in our isolated intensive care unit. *Additional training required. Must be 18+ years of age.
